# **Artist Statement**

**LayeRhythm** is a fusion of street dance, live music and club culture that transcends mainstream boundaries and challenges the status quo. Rooted in the raw energy and creative brilliance of freestyle movements like house dance, lite feet, flexn, breaking, locking, and more, our art defies conventional structures and norms, shining a light on BIPOC creatives and historically underrepresented artists, and showcasing the dynamic power of improvisational music and dance pioneered by Black & Latinx folks, to produce rewarding experiences for all.

In essence, LayeRhythm is a celebration of the pulse of the city—where gritty, vibrant heartbeats foster thriving creativity and innovation. It's an homage to the dancers, musicians, emcees, and vocalists who contribute their talents with fearless authenticity, carving out their own spaces and inscribing their own stories within the cultural fabric.

Drawing inspiration from the genius of freestyle artists, we weave together a tapestry of movement and sound that defies categorization. Each piece is a testament to the power of improvisation and spontaneity, a reflection of the ever-evolving nature of artistic expression.

Yet LayeRhythm goes beyond simply celebrating dance and music—it's a heartfelt vision for a different way of existing, a world where creativity is valued above all else and where art has the power to disrupt, dismantle, and rebuild. Through immersive and collaborative performances, our aim is to create spaces where artists are empowered to thrive, where economic barriers are met with innovative solutions, and where hierarchies are leveled.

At the heart of our artistic narrative lies a fervent conviction: live dance and music serve as powerful agents of healing, not only on a physical plane but also emotionally, traversing the boundaries of social, economic, and cultural divides. By bringing together artists from diverse backgrounds and disciplines, we endeavor to create a community that is inclusive, supportive, and fiercely independent.

In each show, the audience becomes an integral part of the artistic creation, transforming into our muse, their energy and participation shaping the very outcome of the experience. Our performance design is akin to a game, blurring the lines between audience and performers, inviting everyone to co-create and interact within a shared space. Through this dynamic interaction, we forge bonds and cultivate an environment of creativity and joy.

At its core, LayeRhythm is a call to action—a rallying cry for artists to embrace their agency, for institutions to support creative and risk taking visions, and for communities to dance their way towards a future imbued with greater equity and understanding, fostering an ecosystem where performers, presenters, and audiences collaborate in co-creating transformative experiences.

LayeRhythm Productions, Inc. (LPI) highlights freestyle dance and music voices under-recognized in the mainstream performing arts landscape while providing entertainment, building community through play, educating audiences in cultural history, preserving the legacy of street & club dance forms, transforming individuals' relationship to music & dance and supporting emotional & social well-being. LayeRhythm is dedicated to risk-taking improvisation and interactive audience engagement through performances and educational events.

"[LayeRhythm is a] brew of partying and performing that unfolds as a series of interactive sessions in which suggestions from the crowd beget songs and steps. Imagine an improv comedy show where dancing, not laughs, is the currency. Then imagine a musicians' jam session where the band is compelled to keep the dancers' pace instead of the other way around. [...] [W]hat's distinct about LayeRhythm is the way it bridges the two groups with crowd participation" (*The New York Times*).

Since 2015, LayeRhythm (LR), led by Founder/Artistic Director Mai Lê Hồ, has offered NYC recurring interactive, improvisational street/club dance and music events at Meridian 23, Nublu, 275ParkBK, Public Records, as well as performances at venues/festivals such as Jacob's Pillow (MA), USC Kaufman School of Dance (CA), Bridge Street Theater, 92NY Harkness Dance Center, Harris Theater (IL), Movement Research at Judson Church, Abrons Arts Center, The National Jazz Museum in Harlem, Spiegeltent at Bard College, NYU Skirball, and was presented by Works & Process at the Guggenheim Museum, Lincoln Center, SummerStage, NY Public Library for the Performing Arts, Gibney, The Church Sag Harbor, Catskill Mountain Foundation, ArtYard (NJ), Manhattan West Plaza, and Wave Hill. LayeRhythm was selected by CUNY Dance Initiative for residencies at Brooklyn College for the Performing Arts (2021-2022) & Baruch College (2023-2024), and was nominated National Dance Institute's Helen Stambler Neuberger Artist-in-Residence (2022-2023). LR has partnered w/ 92NY, Works & Process, Ladies of Hip-Hop, 36 Chambaz of Stylz, Chicago Dancemakers Forum, USC Visions & Voices, Downtown Brooklyn Partnership, Hook Arts Media, Queens County Farm Museum, PotaY, Teatro Yerbabruja, Hi-ARTS, Rolling Stone. Its educational and professional development programs have been hosted at/supported by Hunter College, Fordham High School for the Performing Arts, NDI, Ladies of Hip-Hop x Snipes studio and the Brooklyn Arts Council.

LPI incorporated as a nonprofit in 2020, and has since received the support of the New York State Council on the Arts, National Endowment for the Arts, NYC Department of Cultural Affairs, New Music USA, Harkness Foundation for Dance, Mertz Gilmore Foundation, Lower Manhattan Cultural Council, Dance/NYC, Hinge and Club Culture Foundation.

Featuring a rotating cast of top-tier local and international street/club dancers, emcees, singers and musicians, the LR experimental platform layers extemporaneous collaborations of artists working from a diverse cultural palette: hip hop, funk, soul, house music, and popping, Campbellocking, breaking, waacking/whacking, Detroit jit, Chicago footwork, krump, flexN, voguing, litefeet, house dance styles.

LR has offered a platform to 500+ local and international street/club dancers and musicians (ages 21-60). Artists include African American, Latinx, Asian, LGBTQ+, and immigrant communities. In 135+ presentations, LR has served a diverse audience of: patrons of clubs, theaters, parks, festivals (45,000+), and online community (5M+).



# Ashton "Stiggity Stackz" Lites, dancer

Ashton Lites (aka Stiggity Stackz or Stackz) is one of Boston's leading freestyle dance artists, with over 15 years of training across Krump, Popping, Locking, House, Hip Hop, Ballet, Tap, Jazz, Modern, and Afro-Haitian dance. As founder of StiggityStackz Worldwide, he leads community-based dance and creative entrepreneurship programs in partnership with organizations such as DS4Si, Boston Ballet, Red Bull, Museum of Science, Artists for Humanity, and The Mass Hip Hop Archive. A 2023 City of Boston Artist-in-Residence, Stackz worked with the Mayor's Office of Arts & Culture and Parks & Recreation Department on creative programming and policy. He is also on faculty at Emerson College, Amherst College, and UMASS Amherst, developing curricula on Hip Hop dance and culture, and has collaborated with acclaimed artists including Rashid Johnson, Nick Cave, Mariona Lloreta, and Masary Studios. @stiggitystackzworldwide

# Mai Lê Hồ, artistic director + dancer

Mai Lê Hồ is a French-Vietnamese dance artist and educator based in NYC. She is the founder and Artistic/Executive Director of LayeRhythm, a nonprofit platform amplifying street and club dance cultures and freestyle artistry. Since 2015, she has produced over 140 editions of LayeRhythm locally and internationally. First introduced to house dance by her late teacher Babson in France, Mai Lê has since won first place in this category at events including Ladies of Hip-Hop (NYC, 2015), Universole (Detroit, 2015), and Step Ya Game Up (NYC, 2013). She has judged competitions such as Sole Open Philly (2024), Footwork Frenzy (2022), House Dance UK (2015), Slick City (Chicago, 2015), and The Blueprint (Houston, 2013). An adjunct professor at Hunter College, she is also a 2023 Dancing Futures resident, a 2024 Bogliasco Foundation Fellow, and a 2025 Simons Foundation & Gibney Open Interval Resident Artist.



## Osyris Antham, MC

Osyris Antham is a 2-time world Champion MC who's performed in 4+ countries and dozens of cities. Brooklyn-bred, he began his music career as a teenage steel pan player, became a poet during college & landed in his home of Hip-Hop as an adult. Osyris has performed at the Guggenheim & the Brooklyn Museum, led Hip-Hop classes at MIT and won rap championships in The U.S., Paris & Prague.
